



\*The first telephone was installed in Locust in 1926 in a Service Station operated by Hoyle Tucker & Fetzer Hartsell, the station was located near where CVS is currently located, at the intersection of 24/27 From Native Americans, to White settlers and African American's, the Locust area has continued to change though the years. And although some things are known about the history of Locust and the peoples that settled and founded this community, much has been lost over time. And now that Locust is on the verge of perhaps the largest single development influx in its history it's important that our heritage be documented so its not lost for future generations.

Thanks to the Locust City Council, the LHSM is currently displaying items in the Council Meeting Room located behind the Locust Library. Items from the 1969 Locust Centennial are also on display at the SCC Crutchfield Campus.
